

Gearing up for Wearable Art Show

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Vintage neckties, a mound of VHS tape, wire and papier-mache, some old sailcloth, a basket of leaves and moss ... what will inspire your design for the fifth annual Port Townsend Wearable Art Show?

Entries for the show are due Jan. 26. Organizers ask for entries in the one of two categories:

"fantastical/supernatural/unexpected" and "art you can really wear." Visit ptwearableart.com for details.

Tickets are now on sale for the 2015 Port Townsend Wearable Art Show, slated for two performances, 2 and 7:30 p.m., May 9, 2015 at McCurdy Pavilion, Fort Worden.

There are 544 numbered seats available for each performance.

A giant screen behind the stage allows audience members to see models up close as well as in person, so everyone can take in the details.

In addition, Fund for Women and Girls is raffling off tickets for an outfit worth as much as \$1,000.

Before the show is a special display of "Art You Can Really Wear," which is for sale before the show, during intermission and after the show.

Juror/judge for the 2015 Wearable Art Show is Yoshiko Wada of Berkeley, California.
